### ETHICAL DECISION MAKING AND CONFLICTS OF INTEREST

## A guiding checklist for councillors, staff and community committees

## Ethical decision making

- Is the decision or conduct legal?
- Is it consistent with government policy, Council's objectives and Code of Conduct?
- What will the outcome be for you, your colleagues, the Council, anyone else?
- Does it raise a conflict of interest?
- Do you stand to gain personally at public expense?
- Can the decision be justified in terms of public interest?
- Would it withstand public scrutiny?

## **Conflict of interest**

A conflict of interest is a clash between private interest and public duty. There are two types of conflict:

- Pecuniary an interest that you have in a matter because of a reasonable likelihood or expectation of appreciable financial gain or loss to yourself or another person or entity defined in part 4 of the Lismore City Council Code of Conduct with whom you are associated.
- Non-pecuniary a private or personal interest that you have that does not amount to a pecuniary interest as defined in the Lismore City Council Code of Conduct. These commonly arise out of family or personal relationships, or out of involvement in sporting, social, religious or other cultural groups and associations, and may include an interest of a financial nature.

### The test for conflict of interest

- Is it likely I could be influenced by personal interest in carrying out my public duty?
- Would a fair and reasonable person believe I could be so influenced?
- Conflict of interest is closely tied to the layperson's definition of "corruption" using public office for private gain.
- Important to consider public perceptions of whether you have a conflict of interest.

## **Identifying problems**

- Do I have private interests affected by a matter I am officially involved in?
- Is my official role one of influence or perceived influence over the matter?
- Do my private interests' conflict with my official role?

## Disclosure and participation in meetings

- A councillor or a member of a Council Committee who has a pecuniary interest in any matter with which the Council is concerned and who is present at a meeting of the Council or Committee at which the matter is being considered must disclose the nature of the interest to the meeting as soon as practicable.
- The councillor or member must not be present at, or in sight of, the meeting of the Council or Committee:
  - a. at any time during which the matter is being considered or discussed by the Council or Committee. or
  - b. at any time during which the Council or Committee is voting on any question in relation to the matter.

**No Knowledge** - a person does not breach this clause if the person did not know and could not reasonably be expected to have known that the matter under consideration at the meeting was a matter in which he or she had a pecuniary interest.

## Non-pecuniary Interests - Must be disclosed in meetings.

There are a broad range of options available for managing conflicts & the option chosen will depend on an assessment of the circumstances of the matter, the nature of the interest and the significance of the issue being dealt with. Non-pecuniary conflicts of interests must be dealt with in at least one of the following ways:

- It may be appropriate that no action be taken where the potential for conflict is minimal. However, councillors should consider providing an explanation of why they consider a conflict does not exist.
- Limit involvement if practical (eg. participate in discussion but not in decision making or vice versa). Care needs to be taken when exercising this option.
- Remove the source of the conflict (eg. relinquishing or divesting the personal interest that creates the conflict)
- Have no involvement by absenting yourself from and not taking part in any debate or voting on the issue as of the provisions in the Code of Conduct (particularly if you have a significant nonpecuniary interest)

Whilst seeking advice is generally useful, the ultimate decision rests with the person concerned.

## **Background**

A request has been received from Business Manager from 62 Diadem Street, Lismore for a dedicated accessible parking space to be implemented at the front of the Cardiololgy Office.

The request is to provide a close proximity parking area available for elderly or mobility restricted patients for the facility.

The writer is advised that she has consulted with Council Rangers on the request and claims support has been provided for the installation of accessible parking at this site.

The Accessibility and Inclusion Group support this proposal within the minutes adopted 12 March 2024 Council Meeting.

## **Site Details**

Diadem Street is a local Collector Road under Councils Road hierarchy and is a two-way undivided sealed road approximately 6.0m wide travel lanes with a mixture of formalised angle parking between Uralba Steret north to Laurel Avenue and non-formal parallel parking from Laurel Avenue north.

Traffic Data (2012) indicates ADT of 1840, 85% speed of 52km/hr and 3% heavy traffic.

### Conclusion

That the Local Traffic Committee provide a recommendation to Council to consider.


#### Good Afternoon





It is recommended that the Local Traffic Committee Council supports the request for Councils Design Team to undertake further investigations for a suitable location to meet relevant Austroads Standards (pending funding) and for Councils Design Services team prepare and plan and estimate.

## **Background**

A Request has been received from Councillor Hall regarding re-establishing an accessible park in Zadoc Street in close proximity to the Lismore Court House and Lismore Police Station.

The existing park is adequate in size to cater for an accessible park without modifications required to line marking and there is an existing ramp to negate any need to modification to the kerb, gutter, and the installation of a kerb ramp.

The Accessibility and Inclusion group support this proposal - Minutes Adopted 12.3.2024 Council Meeting .

## **Site Details**

Zadoc Street is a local road under Councils Road hierarchy, two-way undivided sealed road approximately 21.0m wide.

It is advertised as a bypass for heavy vehicles around the Lismore Central Business District and traffic counts (2015) indicate approximately 2900 Average Daily Traffic with 3.6% heavy vehicle component.

Parking in Zadoc Street is generally 2P angle parking with is typically fully occupied during business hours.

There are two (2) existing Accessible Parks approximately 30m east of this site.

## **Conclusion**

That the Local Traffic Committee review the request and provide a recommendation to Council to consider.

Recommended that the Committee review the request and provide a recommendation.

## **Background**

A request has been received from Councils Property Services Manager in relation to converting a general public car park to an accessible parking space adjacent to 165 Molesworth Street to provide a more user-friendly parking space.

The property team are re-invigorating the site and refurbishing for need tenants.

The Accessibility and Inclusion group support this proposal for Option 1, minutes were adopted at the 12 March 2024 Council Meeting.

## **Site Details**

Molesworth Street is a local road under Councils Road hierarchy, two way divided sealed road approximately 19.9m wide providing access to Councils Central Business District.

The existing Parking in Molesworth Street is 2P Parallel Parking with centre parking.

There are two (2) existing accessible parks on the eastern side of Molesworth Street approximately 20m north of this site.

There are (3) three options available to consider as listed.

Option 1 - Support the request as requested, the works will require modifying existing parking space to Accessible Parking Standards.

Option 2 – Re-establish an area within the off-road parking section for the Old Municipal Building. The works require removal and levelling of gravel, reshaping, resealing, signage and line marking.

Option 3 - Provide additional accessible parking area adjacent to Memorial Baths, previously approved pre covid.

## Conclusion

That the Local Traffic Committee provide a recommendation to Council to consider.

I was taking them through my proposed plans to make the building accessible for all member of the community.





Request for to consider No Stopping Zones in Barham Street and Wyrallah Road as required in conjunction with the Get NSW Active Program, for the installation of two Pedestrian Refuges.

Recommended that the Local Traffic Committee discuss the request and provide recommendation.

## **Background**

Lismore City Council has received funding under the Get NSW Active 2022-2024 Funding Program (Active Transport) for the purpose of constructing a shared path for pedestrians and cyclists providing connectivity between communities and local destinations.

The objective of the Get NSW Active program is to support the development and delivery of walking and cycling projects that:

- Contribute to continuous and connected walking and cycling networks across NSW that connect communities to local destinations.
- Enable more people to safely walk and ride as part of their everyday travel.
- Facilitate children's and young people's independent mobility by improving safe walking and bike riding options for travel to and from school.
- Support multi-modal journeys by integrating active and public transport.
- Deliver quality place outcomes that contribute to vibrant places, and liveable neighbourhoods that support local lifestyles.
- Enable and encourage behaviour change and shift community perception towards walking and cycling as everyday travel options for short trips.
- Deliver walking and cycling connections that enable all people, regardless of gender, to move freely within their communities.

This program is administered by Transport for NSW with projects to be delivered by June 2024.

Eligible infrastructure projects must include design or construction of either:

- New footpaths
- Widening of existing footpaths
- Signed crossings
- Unsigned crossings (including pedestrian refuges)
- Footpaths continuation treatments
- Shared zones (10kmh speed limit)

The successful nominations include:

- 1. Standing Street, The Channon provide a safer travel route for School Children to and from The Channon Public School and recreational walkers in the area.
- 2. Thorburn Street, Nimbin provide a safer travel route for School Children to and from The Nimbin Public School and recreational walkers in the area.
- 3. Dibbs Street, Lismore between Dalziell Street north to Uralba Street. This is designed to provide a safe off-road walking area for pedestrians including hospital staff.
- 4. Elizabeth Street, East Lismore between Wyrallah Road East to Nielson Street. This provides a safer travel route for School Children to and from The Wyrallah Road Public School and recreational walkers in the area.
- 5. Barham Street, East Lismore Between Wyrallah Road south to Atlas Street. This provides connectivity for the East Lismore precinct to the Wyrallah Road Shopping Complex.
- 6. Norwood Avenue and Pleasant Street, Goonellabah. Between Clifford Street east to Fischer Street.

Some components of the design require the Transport and Road Safety Consultation Group to discuss and potentially refer to Council for formal approval.

## Get NSW Active Project – Barham Street, East Lismore Between Atlas Street to Wyrallah Road

### **Traffic Data**

Barham Street, East Lismore classified as an urban sealed collector road, under Councils Road Hierarchy. It is a two-way undivided sealed road and a nominal 8.2m wide. Traffic Data recorded 2013 ADT 1860, 85% percentile 63km/hr and 1.8% heavy vehicle component. It is a 50 kph speed zone.

## **Design Components**

The approved funding from Transport for NSW (TfNSW) is to install a new footpath in Barham Street from Atlas Street through to Wyrallah Road.

Install a new footpath in Barham Street between Atlas Street and Wyrallah Road, East Lismore. The new footpath is to commence on the southern side of the existing bus shelter on the western side of Barham Street.

The new footpath will cross to the eastern side of Barham Street and continue north towards Wyrallah Road. The new footpath will continue around the corner on the southern side of the intersection of Barham Street and Wyrallah Road.

The new footpath will then continue south on the western side of Wyrallah Road for approximately 30m to the first driveway. The new footpath will then cross to the eastern side of Wyrallah Road and connect to the existing footpath which is on the eastern side of Wyrallah Road.

A new pedestrian refuge is to be installed on both Barham Street and Wyrallah Road where the new footpath crosses these streets.

The new footpath has a width of 2m which is identified on the construction plans, attached to this document. The new footpath is to merge into any existing services and driveways within the work zone.

## **Community Consultation**

Council undertook standard community consultation with the surrounding catchment with feedback provided by one resident. The matter was discussed onsite with modifications to the design plan agreed and acted upon to the resident's satisfaction.

## Conclusion

The Traffic and Road Safety Consultation were requested to consider these items:

- 1. Installation of pedestrian refuge in the vicinity of 22 Barham Street and 2 Atlas Street.
- 2. Installation of pedestrian refuge in the vicinity of No. 100 to No. 106 Wyrallah Road.

Noting the installation of pedestrian refuges infrastructure works require:

- a. Installation of footpath connections.
- b. Kerb ramps on both sides.
- c. Relevant signage.
- d. Two (2) centre concrete medians with standard hoop bollards.
- e. No Stopping zones adjacent to the refuge as part of standard pedestrian refuge design in accordance with TfNSW standard drawing T000960.



## New Shared Path - Barham Street, East Lismore (Atlas Street to Wyrallah Road)


Lismore City Council has secured funding from the NSW 2022/23 Get Active (Active Transport) Program to construct a shared path for pedestrians and cyclists along Barham Street, between Atlas Street and Wyrallah Road.

The new path, which will adjoin your boundary, is proposed to be constructed by the end of the 2023/24 financial year. Prior to works commencing a Council representative will contact you to discuss any interruptions to your driveway access as well as any other issues to be considered when finalising the scope of work.

As part of this project, it may be necessary to either trim back or remove some of your garden plantings prior to construction of the new path if any overhang your boundary line onto Barham Street. The diagram below is a guide for the clearance required.

We would appreciate if this trimming could be carried out as soon as convenient and continue to be maintained to the above standard. If you wish to remove a tree from your property, permission from Council may be required and you should contact us for advice before proceeding.
