ETHICAL DECISION MAKING AND CONFLICTS OF INTEREST

A guiding checklist for councillors, staff and community committees

Ethical decision making

- Is the decision or conduct legal?
- Is it consistent with government policy, Council's objectives and Code of Conduct?
- What will the outcome be for you, your colleagues, the Council, anyone else?
- Does it raise a conflict of interest?
- Do you stand to gain personally at public expense?
- Can the decision be justified in terms of public interest?
- Would it withstand public scrutiny?

Conflict of interest

A conflict of interest is a clash between private interest and public duty. There are two types of conflict:

- Pecuniary an interest that you have in a matter because of a reasonable likelihood or expectation of appreciable financial gain or loss to yourself or another person or entity defined in part 4 of the Lismore City Council Code of Conduct with whom you are associated.
- Non-pecuniary a private or personal interest that you have that does not amount to a pecuniary interest as defined in the Lismore City Council Code of Conduct. These commonly arise out of family or personal relationships, or out of involvement in sporting, social, religious or other cultural groups and associations, and may include an interest of a financial nature.

The test for conflict of interest

- Is it likely I could be influenced by personal interest in carrying out my public duty?
- Would a fair and reasonable person believe I could be so influenced?
- Conflict of interest is closely tied to the layperson's definition of "corruption" using public office for private gain.
- Important to consider public perceptions of whether you have a conflict of interest.

Identifying problems

- Do I have private interests affected by a matter I am officially involved in?
- Is my official role one of influence or perceived influence over the matter?
- Do my private interests' conflict with my official role?

Disclosure and participation in meetings

- A councillor or a member of a Council Committee who has a pecuniary interest in any matter with which the Council is concerned and who is present at a meeting of the Council or Committee at which the matter is being considered must disclose the nature of the interest to the meeting as soon as practicable.
- The councillor or member must not be present at, or in sight of, the meeting of the Council or Committee:
 - a. at any time during which the matter is being considered or discussed by the Council or Committee, or
 - b. at any time during which the Council or Committee is voting on any question in relation to the matter.

No Knowledge - a person does not breach this clause if the person did not know and could not reasonably be expected to have known that the matter under consideration at the meeting was a matter in which he or she had a pecuniary interest.

Non-pecuniary Interests - Must be disclosed in meetings.

There are a broad range of options available for managing conflicts & the option chosen will depend on an assessment of the circumstances of the matter, the nature of the interest and the significance of the issue being dealt with. Non-pecuniary conflicts of interests must be dealt with in at least one of the following ways:

- It may be appropriate that no action be taken where the potential for conflict is minimal. However, councillors should consider providing an explanation of why they consider a conflict does not exist.
- Limit involvement if practical (eg. participate in discussion but not in decision making or vice versa). Care needs to be taken when exercising this option.
- Remove the source of the conflict (eg. relinquishing or divesting the personal interest that creates the conflict)
- Have no involvement by absenting yourself from and not taking part in any debate or voting on the issue as of the provisions in the Code of Conduct (particularly if you have a significant non-pecuniary interest)

Whilst seeking advice is generally useful, the ultimate decision rests with the person concerned.


A resident on Barham Street has submitted a request for the installation of a "No Stopping" zone in front of their driveway.


The resident has raised concerns that vehicles frequently park opposite the driveway, making it difficult, and in some cases impossible, for them to safely enter or exit their property.

Additionally, the resident noted that vehicles coming downhill from Barham Street toward the intersection of Floral Avenue have experienced near-miss incidents due to cars parked on that side of the road.

Barham Street is an urban sealed two-way undivided road. It is a nominal 6.9m wide with no parking restrictions on either side of the road.

A resident on Gordon Blair Drive has submitted a request for the installation of a "No Stopping" zone near to their driveway.



A resident on Dibbs Street has submitted a request for the installation of a "No Stopping" zone near to their driveway.

The resident has expressed concerns that parents of Our Lady Help of Christians School frequently park on the driveway and across it, obstructing access and making it difficult for residents to safely enter or exit the property.

School teachers and parents have been approached to address the issue, but resident's efforts have not been successful in resolving it.

Dibbs Street (between Jacaranda Avenue and Dalley Street) is a two-way sealed road. The road is nominally 10.2m wide with no parking restriction on either side except in the pedestrian crossing area.


The area has no traffic accident history as per the attached site detail.


The Mothers Club has been notified and its members will be informed to park in the available spaces.
